ANSWERS from other side: 1. Our government is already ignoring the Constitution, why would a new amendment be any different? 2. The only difference is that amendments have the prohibition that "no State ... shall be deprived of it's equal Suffrage (vote) in the Senate ... without its Consent" 3. The Constitution gives no hints of the ability to limit a convention, but refers to it as "a Convention for proposing Amendments" (plural) 4. The ratification process can be controlled by Congress, or rewritten by the Convention, to assure ratification by the States. 5. "history", "Constitution" 6.
